Students who apply to St. Mary's after Dec. 15 will be considered for scholarships on a case-by-case basis, therefore the scholarship amounts may differ from what is posted above.

St. Mary's reserves the right to replace your scholarship with other gift aid source(s) of the same amount. If you are eligible for more than one St. Mary's University academic scholarship, only the scholarship of the highest value will be awarded.

FINANCIAL AID

Students interested in applying for additional need-based financial assistance must submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year to determine eligibility for institutional, state or federal need-based grant and/or loan programs.

The FAFSA is available beginning October 2018 for the 2019-2020 academic year and should be submitted using you and your family's 2017 income tax information.
